Contest Details

1. The deadline for completed essays is the close of business on March 22, 2019. Any essay that is submitted via mail must be postmarked no later than March 20, 2019.
2. Student must be in the 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade.
3. Student must live in one of the following counties: Westchester (NY), Rockland (NY), Southern Fairfield (CT).
4. Each student may submit one essay per year.
5. The essay must be the work of a single student and authored by the student.
6. Essay length must fall within the following limits: 500-2000 words.
7. No purchase or obligation required.

All essays are evaluated in a fair and anonymous multi-round judging process. Key areas of judging are:
Personal voice: Judges will be looking for an interesting and engaging essay told in your own words. The essay should describe your experience and an overall message about how your experience impacted your life.
Clarity and style: Judges will look for a clear and consistent focus in your writing and a logical progression of ideas. Good grammar, accurate word choices and correct punctuation and sentence structure should be used.
